

Awards for Graduation

The **ACH Academic Award** - Completed all the requirements academically to earn the Academic Letter.

The **Activities Award** is given to the student who puts in many extra hours and efforts in school activities.

The **Attendance Award** is given to the student with the best attendance during their 4 years of high school.

The **Boy Athlete of the Year Award and Girl Athlete of the Year** are based on responsibility, school involvement and school spirit and are voted on by ACH High School Faculty.

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The **Citizenship Award** is given to the student who volunteers their time for others and demonstrates great character, which influences others to be the best they are capable of being.

The **CTE 21st Century Success Skills Award** – Given to the students who show success on the precision assessment measuring fundamental personal traits, knowledge, and skills that assist a successful transition from secondary education into the workforce and post-secondary education.

The **CTE General Financial Literacy Award** - Measures standards that are essential to the development of basic financial and economic reasoning. The goal of GFL is to help students to become financially responsible and conscientious members of society as they contribute to their own financial well-being.

The **CTE 21st Industry Award** – Given to the students who show success on the precision assessment measuring fundamental skills pertaining to a specific CTE area of study.

The **EVERFI Accounting Careers Certification** - Measures knowledge regarding how an accounting background can help students achieve their career goals. Learners are exposed to the wide range of careers available in the accounting and finance space. This assessment measures extensive benefits accounting skills can provide in business or in daily life, including contexts like entrepreneurship, investing, and personal finance.

The **EVERFI Financial Literacy Certificate** - Measures student's knowledge regarding how to make wise financial decisions to promote financial well-being over their lifetime. Students explored complex financial concepts and gained actionable strategies for managing their finances through a series of interactive, real-life scenarios.

The **Honors Award** is an academic achievement award for those students who have maintained a 3.25 throughout their 4 years of high school.

Honor Band/Choir - Student has been selected to participate and perform in the Bi-County Honor Band/Choir ensemble.

The **Leadership Award** is based on being a good communicator and leader while inspiring others to be the best that they can be.

The **Matt Strauss Character Award** is the most prestigious award given. It is based on honesty, truthfulness, morality, trustworthiness, courtesy, compassion, tolerance and industry. This award is voted on by the staff.

The **Performing Arts Award** is a unique award given in recognition to a student who has excelled in band, choir and drama.

The **Presidential Award** is given by the President of the United States to those students who have a cumulative grade point average of 3.50 and above

The **Salutatorian Award** is given to the graduating senior with the second highest grade point average.

The **School Spirit Award** is given to the student who has shown the most enthusiasm and school spirit during their 4 years in high school.

The **Sportsmanship Award** is given to the student who demonstrates a positive competitive attitude with their teammates and opponent. Voted on by Warrior Coaches.

The **Valedictorian Award** is given to the graduating senior with the highest grade point average.

The **Warrior Broadcast Network Award** is given to the senior who has demonstrated excellence in video broadcasting.

The **Individual Subject** Awards are given to the student(s) who have shown exceptional knowledge in the subject area during their four years in high school: **Ag, Art, Band, Calculus, Childhood Development, Chorus, Drama, English, Math, Physical Education, Physics, Science, Social Studies, Spanish, and Yearbook.**
